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
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


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



Celebrating in Penang's 100th Special Edition

The George Town Literary Festival (GTLF), held annually in the UNESCO World Heritage site of George Town, Penang, is set to make its much-anticipated return this year.

An initiative by the Penang State Government, it is currently the largest literary festival in Malaysia. Since its inception in 2011 with just five writers, the GTLF has grown into Malaysia's premier literary festival and was the first Southeast Asian event to receive The Literary Festival Award at the 2018 London Book Fair International Excellence Awards.

This year's theme, 'Word on the Street', invites visitors to experience George Town in a new light, where every street corner has a story to tell. Now in its 14th edition, the festival will once again be organised by the Penang Institute, which last managed the event in 2015. Attendees can enjoy a unique literary journey, starting at China Street Ghaut, winding through Beach Street, passing St. Xavier's Institution, and culminating at the majestic Cheong Fatt Tze – The Blue Mansion on Leith Street.

"Penang's literary culture is as vibrant as its streets," says Dato' Dr. Ooi Kee Beng, Executive Director of Penang Institute. "With support from local businesses, hosting the GTLF allows us to showcase the creativity flourishing in our city and inspire both locals and visitors."

GTLF 2024 will feature 12 panel sessions, five book launches, three reading sessions, two creative workshops, a poetry reading, and more. Topics will span cross-cultural perspectives on love, the future of citizen journalism, and creative non-fiction storytelling.

Last year, the festival attracted over 5,000 attendees, and this year, an even larger crowd is expected. So, if you're planning a trip to Penang, why not time it with this literary celebration? Stroll through the historic streets of George Town and let the stories unfold.

Deepavali commemorates the triumph of good over evil, light over darkness, and wisdom over ignorance. This festival is a time for prayer, celebration, and togetherness.


Mithai, often made with ingredients such as milk, ghee (clarified butter), coconut, sugar, fruit, spice, nuts, rice, flour, and sometimes adorned with gold or silver leaf, are offered to deities and gods at temples before being shared among family, friends, and fellow worshippers, to symbolise sharing joy and blessings.

The preparation of these sweets is a beloved tradition that unites families. Generational recipes, which are rich in history, involve

Penang is set to undergo a significant transformation in its power infrastructure with the completion of Tenaga Nasional Berhad (TNB)'s landmark monopole transmission towers by November 2024. The project, a massive RM500 million investment which commenced in July 2022 runs parallel to the iconic Penang Bridge. It is designed to bolster the







state's electricity supply, ensuring reliability and a sustainable and energy-efficient future.

The strategic placement of the monopole towers will allow for efficient energy distribution, reducing the risk of power outages and enhancing the overall resilience of Penang's electrical grid. The project is on track for completion in November 2024, significantly reducing the load on existing power transmission lines and contributing to the seamless functioning of residential, commercial, and industrial activities across the state.

The monopole transmission towers represent a blend of cuttingedge engineering and thoughtful urban planning, designed to occupy minimal space while maximising efficiency. Standing tall alongside the Penang Bridge, they will not only provide a robust power transmission solution but also contribute to the aesthetic appeal of the area.

This landmark project will play a crucial role in supporting the state's aspirations as Penang continues to grow and evolve.

A Historical Revival of **Fort Cornwallis**





The 19th-century moat that originally encircled Fort Cornwallis, one of Penang's most iconic landmarks, is being restored on its southern and western sides after being buried for more than a century.

This restoration initiative, a collaboration between the Penang Chief Minister Incorporated and Think City with technical advice from the Aga Khan Trust for Culture (AKTC), is a vital component of the George Town North Seafront Masterplan. Encompassing 14 projects and totalling approximately RM140 million, this plan has been developed by the George Town Conservation and Development Corporation.

Comprising comprehensive archaeological research and reconstruction to preserve the authenticity of the moat, the project offers residents and visitors a glimpse into the region's historical defence mechanisms. It also contributes to George Town's cultural

richness and reinforces Penang's environmentally conscious approach to urban design. The new water body and its surrounding landscape will reduce the heat island effect and introduce a green habitat with associated wildlife in the heart of the historic area.

The restoration marks a vital step in preserving Penang's historical architecture for future generations while expanding public space and amenities in the central concourse area of this historical monument. The south moat was officially unveiled by Chief Minister YAB Chow Kon Yeow in conjunction with the recent George Town Heritage Day.



restoration of the west moat is underway and slated for completion in February 2025, with both moats officially opening in July 2025.

located on Jalan Masjid Kapitan Keling (formerly Pitt Street), is a major tourist attraction, well-known for its diverse religious houses of worship from different faiths, offering a glimpse into the rich multicultural heritage of our beloved Penang.

George Town, a UNESCO World Heritage site since July 2008, offers many interesting sights for the locals and visitors alike. You will always come across something interesting, whether it's a well-preserved row of shophouses, a stately colonial building, an exquisite clan house, a historic mosque, intriguing curio shops, stunning street art or a tiny mom-and-pop food stall. The following is just the beginning of our recommended one-day trip within the heritage enclave of George Town. Let's explore!

圣乔治教堂

St. George's Church

The St. George's Church is the oldest Anglican church in the country. Built in 1818, it stands at the corner of Lebuh Farquhar and Jalan Masjid Kapitan Keling. It is the oldest purpose-built Anglican church in Southeast Asia, modelled after a church in Madras, India. The church maintains much of its original setting and was elevated to the status of procathedral in 2023.

甲必丹吉灵清真寺 Kapitan Keling Mosque

The Kapitan Keling Mosque is Penang's oldest and largest monumental mosque, built in the early 19th century by Indian Muslim traders. Located on Jalan Masjid Kapitan Keling, the mosque's striking architecture features Mughal-style domes, minarets, and arches. It serves as a central place of worship for the Muslim community and is a prominent landmark in the core zone of George Town UNESCO

World Heritage Site. Permission to enter must be obtained from the mosque officials.

Goddess of Mercy Temple

Proceed beyond the church onto Jalan Masjid Kapitan Keling, and you will notice a Chinese temple on your right. The Goddess of Mercy Temple, commonly known as "Kuan Yin Teng", was built in the 1800s to worship the goddess Kuan Yin. It has a sweeping roof with intricately sculpted copings and ridges. Devotees of all ages offer joss sticks, donations, flowers and sandalwood incense as they pray for good health, success, wealth, fertility and longevity. The temple is open from 8.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. daily.



斯里玛哈玛丽亚曼印度庙 Sri Mahamariamman Temple (Lebuh Queen)

The Sri Mahamariamman Temple, built in 1833, is the oldest Hindu temple in Penang. It features magnificently sculptured entrance gate, hand-made sculptures of Hindu deities, sacred animals, and impressive architecture. The temple is located on Lebuh Oueen in Little India, with its back facing Jalan Masjid Kapitan Keling. It is open daily from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. and from 4.30 p.m. to 9.00 p.m. Do seek permission, be properly dressed, and remove shoes before entering.





Acheen Street Malay Mosque

Cross from the Kapitan Keling Mosque into Lebuh Acheh (Acheen Street), where the octagonal, Arabstyle minaret marks the entrance to the Acheen Street Malay Mosque, a stunning piece of architecture and one of Penang's oldest mosques. Founded in 1808 by Tengku Syed Hussain Al-Aidid, a wealthy Acehnese merchant of Arab royal descent, the mosque was built to serve the growing Muslim immigrant community. Adjacent to the mosque is the mausoleum of Tengku Syed Hussain and his family.







Penang's museums offer a captivating mix of culture, history, and creativity. Whether you're a history buff, a foodie, or an art lover, these must-visit museums promise to captivate and inspire.
